COVID-19 INFORMATION FOR MOZAMBIQUE

What you need to know

As the situation remains very fluid, the relevant Government and/or Health Authorities may change protocols, at any given time, or in particular to any given passenger or case.

Flying / Driving to Mozambique

Fully vaccinated travellers do not need to present a negative PCR test to enter Mozambique. Proof of vaccination, featuring a QR code, must be readily available. The last dose, must have been administered at least 14 days before arrival. All unvaccinated travellers aged 12 years and older, must travel with a negative PCR test, no older than 72 hours.

We strongly recommend that you have comprehensive travel insurance that will not only cover normal travel emergencies, but will also cover the costs of quarantine in destinations should you or your travel companions test positive in the destination.

Third Party Insurance is compulsory for all non-Mozambican registered vehicles entering the country.

Flying back to South Africa

Travellers, irrespective of their vaccination status, do not need to present a negative PCR test before flying to South Africa.

Should your onward destination require a negative PCR test, your resort can facilitate your test for you, payable directly. Please ensure that you advise the hotel on check-in that you require assistance with PCR testing.

We recommend pre-printing and completing all the forms and questionnaire listed on our website.

Please note that it remains the relevant country's health authority's prerogative to change quarantine and/or COVID protocols, at any given time.

MOZAMBIQUE TRAVEL TIPS

Language

Portuguese is the official language, although English is generally spoken in hotels and beach lodges.

Culture

Mozambicans share a common culture in their love and expression of song, poetry, dynamic dance and performance – all of which derive their influences from Swahili, Bantu and other ethnic groups as well as Islam and Europe, especially Portugal.

Climate

Mozambique has a tropical climate with two seasons, a wet (summer) season from October to March and a dry (winter) season from April to September. Temperatures average around 28°C with a sunny and warm coastline even in midwinter..

Visas & Passports

South Africans do not require a visa for stay of up to 30 days. Passports must be valid for at least 6 months after your date of travel and need to have at least 3 blank pages.

Currency

The official currency is the Metical (plural Meticais) but if you're travelling in southern Mozambique both the South African Rand and US Dollar are widely accepted. In the north it's best to carry dollars.

Electricity

Generally two prong round plugs should be suitable but an international adaptor is recommended.

Health

Drink only bottled water and take the necessary precautions against the sun, insects and malaria

Time difference

There is no time difference with South Africa.
